

Transfer Assistance Guide

EICC: Clinton, Muscatine & Scott Community College Iowa State University – Pre-Veterinary Science

This Transfer Assistance Guide is intended to assist students who plan to transfer to Iowa State University and pursue a degree in Veterinary Science. Note that ISU encourages students to complete a bachelor's degree before applying to the ISU College of Veterinary Science. Some of the most popular options include Animal Science, Animal Ecology, and Biology. Students are not limited to this list however. Students are advised to reference the transfer plan for the major they are interested in along with this guide. Use this guide with an A.S. graduation worksheet to earn your associate's degree prior to transfer. Note that an A.S. degree transfers on a course-by-course basis meaning the ISU Registrar will review each course to decide whether they will accept the course for transfer. Use the tools described in this Guide to assist you in selecting courses that you know will transfer.

Admissions Partnership Program: Through the Admissions Partnership program you will be assigned an ISU Advisor while completing courses at Clinton, Muscatine or Scott Community Colleges. If you plan to earn a bachelor's degree at ISU prior to entry into the College of Veterinary Science, keep in mind the following ISU graduation requirements as you pursue your associate's degree:

U.S. Diversity and International Perspectives Requirements- Iowa State University has an International Perspectives and a U.S. Diversity graduation requirement. It is helpful to select courses that will fulfill these requirements while earning your associate degree. Please see the attached list of courses which will transfer as fulfilling these requirements.

Foreign Language Requirement- This requirement varies depending on the major you pursue at ISU. See an advisor if you need assistance in locating the foreign language requirement of your intended ISU major.
