

**Transfer Assistance Guide
Eastern Iowa Community Colleges/Western Illinois University
Liberal Arts & Sciences**

This Transfer Assistance Guide is intended to assist students who plan to transfer to Western Illinois University and pursue a bachelor's degree in Liberal Arts & Sciences. This degree program may be completed at the QC Campus or Macomb Campus. Use this guide with an A.A. Graduation Worksheet to select your courses. **Note: This document was accurate on the date it was prepared but may not reflect subsequent changes by WIU or EICC. For this reason this document should be used as a guide only and should not replace consultation with your community college advisor or WIU advisor.**

Dual Admission Program: Through Dual Admissions you may apply for admission to WIU as soon as you complete your application with Clinton, Muscatine or Scott Community Colleges. Dual Admissions will provide you with customized advising and degree progress information as you complete each semester at your community college. To participate in this program, you will need to complete a WIU application and a [Dual Admission Program Addendum found at http://www.student.services.wiu.edu/admissions/transfer/pdf/ONLINEADDENDUMREQUEST.pdf](http://www.student.services.wiu.edu/admissions/transfer/pdf/ONLINEADDENDUMREQUEST.pdf). There is also a dual enrollment option for full-time students and if eligible you may also choose to take a course at WIU while taking classes to earn your associate's degree. Your community college advisor can provide you with additional information.

Transfer: Students transferring to WIU with an A.A. or an A.S. and a cumulative G.P.A. of at least 2.00 will be admitted as a junior. A maximum of 64 community college credit hours may be transferred, but are not guaranteed. Completing the AA degree does not guarantee that you will have satisfied the General Education requirements of the College of Arts and Sciences at WIU. The WIU Registrar has the final authority for accepting or rejecting credit for transfer. Students who do not complete an A.A. or A.S. prior to transfer will have their courses reviewed and accepted on a course-by-course basis. Foreign Language/Global Issues Requirement: This can be done before entering WIU in several ways.

1. If you have completed at least 3 years of a foreign language at the High School level with at least a C.
2. If you can demonstrate competence in any foreign language other than English
3. By taking ONE of the following courses at EICC:

Minimum Course Grades:

WIU requires a minimum grade of C for English Composition I (ENG:105) and English Composition II (ENG:106).
