Job Outlook

Employment of lodging managers is expected to grow 8 percent from 2014 to 2020, which is slower than the average for all occupations. Over the decade, travel and tourism is expected to grow, however. Median annual wages of hospitality managers were \$46,800 in May 2014. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$29,460, and the top 10 percent earned more than \$87,920.
