

ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING

Program Description

Nursing is the largest health care profession in the United States. The nursing profession offers a wide variety of opportunities and specialties. Eastern Iowa Community Colleges Associate of Applied Science Nursing degree is fully approved at the state level by the Iowa Board of Nursing and at the federal level by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing. Graduates are eligible to write licensure exams and to work in all 50 states.

The clinical component of the course of study is a strength of the programs. There are two clinical days per week, on average. This is a combination of direct patient care, care conferences, observational experiences and nursing simulation laboratory. Eastern Iowa Community Colleges has partnered with four year institutions to encourage, assist, and support the graduate's completion of a Bachelor of Science in Nursing.

The Nursing program is accredited by the Iowa Board of Nursing.
