

RESPIRATORY CARE

Program Description

Respiratory care practitioners are allied health specialists who play a crucial role within the health care team. Working closely with physicians and other health care professionals, they care for patients with respiratory and cardiovascular conditions. Under the supervision of a physician, they are involved with the assessment, treatment, diagnostic testing, rehabilitation, and prevention of conditions that affect the respiratory and cardiovascular systems. Employment opportunities are found in hospitals, clinics, home health care agencies, product support and sales, education, rehabilitation and continuing care, and health/disease prevention programs.

Significant Points

Experience/Skills/Personality Traits

Respiratory care workers must have the capacity to accept great responsibility for patients, stay calm in emergency situations, and have a genuine desire to care for others. They work with ventilators and other sophisticated machinery, so it helps to be hands-on and have mechanical aptitude. Math skills are also necessary to compute medication dosages and calculate test results. Communication skills and the ability to follow orders are also vital.

Physical Demands

Daily activities require bending, stooping, squatting, reaching, pushing, and pulling in all directions. You will be asked to lift and carry objects weighing up to a minimum of 50 pounds and also shared weight. Clinical tasks require use of hands for repetitive action such as simple and firm grasping and fine manipulation, and walking, including stair stepping. Respiratory care practitioners may also be in contact with communicable diseases and chemical/biohazardous materials and odors.

Partnership between EICC and NICC

A Respiratory Therapy program is available to our students through a cooperative partnership between Eastern Iowa Community Colleges (Clinton, Muscatine and Scott Community Colleges) and Northeast Iowa Community College (NICC). The program is accredited by the Committee on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC).

Transferring to NICC

Students need to complete an NICC application indicating a major in Respiratory Therapy. Students must also complete a transcript request form at the Registrar's Office of CCC, MCC or SCC so that the Registrar submits their course transcript to NICC.

COSTS OF PROGRAM

In addition to tuition and books, the educational costs of the respiratory therapy program include:

- Background Check \$15.00 per last name
- Physical Exam/Immunizations Varies based on student's health insurance coverage and immunizations needed
- Drug Testing \$75.00
- Apparel, Clinical Supplies \$230.00
- Computerized Testing Package \$300.00
- Clinical Transportation (Gas and Lodging) Varies

CLINICALS

Current physical, immunization records, and American Heart Health Care Provider CPR or the American Red Cross CPR for the Professional Rescuer certification must be complete before attending the clinical portion of the respiratory care courses. A criminal record/child abuse registry check is also required and a positive report may prevent you from attendance in clinical and completion of the program. The clinical site may also require documentation of health insurance coverage and drug screening.

Students complete their clinical experiences in Dubuque, Iowa City, and Manchester, Iowa; and in Madison, Wisconsin.

Graduates of the Respiratory Care AAS are eligible for credentialing exams offered by the National Board for Respiratory Care (NBRC).

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
