

Transfer Assistance Guide EICCs: Clinton, Muscatine & Scott Community College Iowa Wesleyan College - Elementary Education

This Transfer Assistance Guide is intended to assist students who plan to transfer to Iowa Wesleyan College and pursue a B.S. in Elementary Education. Use this guide with an A.A. Graduation Worksheet to select your courses.

Note: This document was accurate on the date it was prepared but may not reflect subsequent changes by IWC or EICCs. For this reason this document should be used as a guide only and should not replace consultation with your community college advisor or IWC advisor.

Joint Admission Program: Through a Joint Admission Agreement with IWC, students receive additional information and advisement from IWC to assist in their course selection and transfer. Complete an Application for Joint Admission after formal admission to Clinton, Muscatine or Scott Community College, but prior to earning 30 credit hours. For more information, contact the advising office of your community college.

Transfer: Students transferring to IWC with an A.A. or an A.S. and a cumulative G.P.A. of at least 2.00 will be admitted as a junior and will be deemed to have fulfilled the IWC Wesleyan Studies/General Education Curriculum with the exception of WS 357 Human Relations: Global Perspectives for Educators, which must be completed at IWC. Information about additional IWC graduation requirements can be found in the IWC catalog. Note that one of these requirements Safety and Survival may be fulfilled by presenting a current and active CPR or First Aid Certification to the IWC Registrar.

Minimum Course Grades:

IWC requires a minimum grade of C for English Composition I (ENG: 105 or ENG:107) and a minimum grade of C for English Composition II (ENG:106 or ENG:108). Students earning a lower grade in these courses will need to repeat the course. IWC also requires a minimum grade of C- for any course transferred to fulfill a major course requirement at IWC.

Portfolio of Education Coursework Completed: Students should create a portfolio consisting of all education related coursework, including a record of any time spent in classroom observation. In addition, a basic skills test is required – CAAP, C-Base or Praxis Core. Please consult with IWC for further details regarding appropriate materials to include in the portfolio and the basic skills test.

Foreign Language: There is no foreign language requirement to earn a Bachelor's degree at IWC.
