IMPORTANT: The VA requires Eastern Iowa Community College to evaluate and report (if appropriate) transfer credit from all prior educational experiences. Therefore, official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions that you have attended (whether or not the GI Bill® was used) are needed to process your admissions and enrollment certification.

YOU WILL NOT BE CERTIFIED FOR PAYMENT BEYOND THE FIRST TERM IF THESE TRANSCRIPTS ARE NOT SECURED.

In order to remain eligible for VA benefits, you must maintain satisfactory progress. This is defined to you in your VA handbook.

You will be certified only for those courses that apply toward your degree goal.

If Tuition Scholarships are awarded to Chapter 33 veterans, this Scholarship will be deducted from the tuition and fees that are submitted for payment to the VA.

You must notify your Certifying Official; Clinton, Muscatine or Scott Community College when you register for any semester. You must also notify your Certifying Official if you alter your registration in any way; this includes dropping or adding a class, terminating school, changing programs or majors, or any other changes that would affect your payment status.

If you are registered for **all** online courses, you will not be eligible for a percentage of the BAH based on the total credits.

You may not repeat courses that have been previously completed with a passing grade unless it is required for your Program of Study.

Unofficial withdrawals will affect your eligibility and may cause you to be charged with a substantial overpayment.

The Chapter 33 housing allowance will be paid if the rate of pursuit is more than 50%:

6 credits (or credit equivalents) is 50% ($6 \div 12 = 50\%$)

7 credits (or credit equivalents) is 58% ($7 \div 12 = 58\%$)

Spouses of active duty personnel receiving Transfer of Entitlement (ToE) benefits are not eligible for the Housing Allowance
